Outdoor Redevelopment Update

We first began planning to redevelop our outdoor play space in November 2020 and we are extremely excited that demolition work will finally start in May!!

Productivity Commission ECEC inquiry: call for submissions

The Productivity Commission has called for submissions for its inquiry into Australia's early childhood education and care (ECEC) system.

Initial submissions are due by 19 May 2023 and can be made through the Productivity Commission website. The Commission will also seek submissions after it releases its draft report in late November 2023.

You can also make a brief comment at any time.

The inquiry will make recommendations to support affordable, accessible, equitable and high-quality ECEC that reduces barriers to workforce participation and supports children's learning and development.

The inquiry began on 1 March 2023. The Commission will provide its final report to the Australian Government by 30 June 2024.

Being a brave explorer at mealtimes; developing self-help skills and

inter-dependence







What does self-help skills look like for young children?

- Begin to use a spoon and fork to feed self
- Drink from cup independently
- Take socks and shoes off
- Put arms through sleeves and legs through pants
- Try to wash face and hands
- Help re-set and put toys away

Inter-dependence definition: Inter-dependence occurs when a trusted adult fosters age-appropriate independence while still being aware enough of the child's developmental stage to function safely.

The Yitpi Tarnanthi children are becoming increasingly aware of the needs and rights of others at mealtimes. They have been open to new discoveries such as feeding themselves with a spoon, washing their face and hands, and putting their food scraps into the compost container. They have recognised their individual achievements and the achievements of others by saying "Good job" or clapping their hands after their mealtime 'jobs' have been completed.

We would love to be able to see a 'mini moment' of your child using their self-help skills and inter-dependence at home. E.g.
