This is a national campaign that encourages exploration and tasting of a wide range of fruit and vegetables, and helps children understand that we all need a wide range of different coloured fruit and vegetables for good health.

Last week ended on a sad note with the passing of our much-loved guinea pig, Eddie.

The children and educators had spent time with him on Wednesday and Thursday, and we don't believe that Eddie was unwell or in visible pain. A small group of children joined

Anila and Rowena in the compost yard on Friday, to help dig a hole to bury Eddie in and spent the time together talking about what Eddie had meant to them and sharing their understandings of death. Some of you might remember that last April, we lost Eddie's very best friend, our rabbit Ginny. We had Ginny cremated, but have not known what to do with her ashes. We now know that her ashes will go next to where Eddie is buried, and we will lay a small monument that the children will be able to decorate to celebrate two very special and loved animals.

If your child is asking questions about death, "Beginnings and Endings with Lifetimes in Between" by Bryan Mellonie, is a gentle and comforting children's book we read here at the Centre that explains the concept of life and death to children in a simple and easy to understand way.
