No mobile phones in children's rooms



One of the national changes to improve child safety is a ban on educators having personal mobile devices in the children's rooms and playspaces.

This has been our practice for a long time, but this is now part of a new policy & procedure called Safe use of digital technologies and online environments.

We are also asking parents to put your phones away when you enter your child's room or the outdoor yard, or when we have Centre events. Use these times to enjoy being with your child or to talk with educators.

If you use your phone to sign your child in via the ipad, then do this at the ipad near the office.

FEES to increase October 13 2025

The Maanagement Committee met on Wednesday 17th September to discuss the budget for 2026.

As a not for profit Centre, our fees are set by the Committee (of parents & staff) to cover our wages and running costs. The Committee have decided upon a small increase in child care fees in order to meet increased cost. For most families this should only result in a small increase to your weekly bill.

There is no change to Preschool fees.

The new fees will come into effect at the start of Term 4 on Monday 13 October .

Full Time Weekly Fee \$680

Full day fee \$141

Morning session (7-12:30) \$74.50 (inc lunch)

Afternoon session \$71.50

Before preschool care \$8.00

After preschool care \$37.50

Preschool fee \$230 per term

7am Monday 5th January 2025.

PAYMENT OF FEES

As a not-for profit Centre it is important that all fees are paid regularly and on time. Parents are expected to pay fees weekly or fortnightly unless special arrangements are made with the Director or Finance Officer. Continued failure to pay your fees may result in your child's care being suspended until fees are paid or a payment plan is in place. Preschool fees are due in full by Week 5 of each Term unless a payment plan is in place.

There are 2 ways you can pay:

- bank transfer (details on your account)
- credit card at the office

Sun Protection

This time of year the weather can be very changeable- with a wide range of temperatures. We can have wind, rain and sunshine. We know it can be a challenge to know how to dress your child and what to pack.

Dressing children in several light layers of clothing means that they can remove or add layers to help regulate their body temperature.

It is also a good idea to pack a rain coat so that we can continue playing outside most days. Please write your child's name on their clothes to avoid clothes getting lost. If you have lost something, check the lost property basket, or speak with an educator.


Children need to wear sunhats

Please put a sunhat in your child's bag each day, or leave one for them at the Centre. Sun hats are required every day from August to May in order to protect our skin from the harmful effects of the sun. Even on the cold cloudy days in September, the UV (Ultra violet) levels are high.

Please remove any drawstrings or cords from hats as these are a safety issue!

We also put sunscreen on the children whenever the UV index is 3 or above.



You can get a free Sunsmart App for your phone so that you can check the UV levels each day too. This is really useful for knowing when to use sunscreen at home
